The Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme

The Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme (LCVP) combines the academic strengths of the Leaving Certificate (established) with a focus on self-directed learning, enterprise, work and the community. The primary goal of the LCVP is to prepare young people for adult life by ensuring that they are educated in the broadest sense, with an ability to cope in an environment of rapid change.

The Leaving Certificate Applied Programme

The L.C.A. caters for students who do not wish to take the traditional Leaving Certificate. The Leaving Certificate Applied is self-contained two-year programme aimed at preparing students for adult and working life. The programme puts an emphasis on forms of achievement which the established Leaving Certificate has not recognised in the past.

School Partnership

Partnership is central to our school's philosophy. Parents, staff, students and our Trustee all have a role to play in the life of our school.

The Parents' Association

The school has an active parents' Association that supports all aspects of school life and development. It meets regularly and consults with the principal on many aspects of school life. Two parents are nominated to serve on the Board of Management.

Students' Council – Comhairle Mhic Chairthinn

The contribution which students have to make in the daily life of the school is reflected in the work of our vibrant Student Council. The Students Council is consulted by the principal on a range of matters and has a key role to play in the development of school policies.

The Students' Council represent the views of students on matters of concern to the student body thereby influencing school policy. The Students' Council elects and is led by the school's Head Prefect and Deputy Head prefect. They act as chairperson and secretary to the Students' Council and officially represent the student body at all formal school occasions.

The work of the Students' Council is facilitated by an Assistant Principal and the Students' Council meets with the principal and representatives of the Board of Management on a regular basis.

The Students' Council enhances the school and promotes respect throughout the school community.

Board of Management

The school is managed on behalf of the Bishop of Clogher and the Department of Education and Skills by a Board of Management.

The Board is comprised of two parents' nominees, two staff nominees and four members of the local community nominated by the Bishop of Clogher, former principal and president of St. Macartan's College Bishop MacDaid.





THE COLLEGE CREST

The crest of St. Macartan's College was designed by the artist, Richard J. King, for the centenary of 1940. It is modelled on the front panels of the circular boss at the centre of the 14th century Clogher Cross.

The panels contain the interlaced letters DEUS (God), and underneath is the motto of the college, Fortis et Fidelis (Strong and Faithful).
